Welcome to Trainer's Secret, and thanks for your purchase. We know you have several questions because we had to market this without giving away any "secrets" or we wouldn't have a book to sell.

Have you won money betting at the track most days, or would you put yourself in the class as losing money but loving the entertainment of the sport? I suspect you are on the losing side, or you would not have purchased this book.

Have you always wondered how people hit longshots that you could not have handicapped no matter what? Well, feel comfortable; we have always lost money as well until we cracked the code in the Trainer's Secret.

First, we want to say that we are not saying Trainers are cheating but using what the Racetrack system allows them to do, so they have information that is not made public to the fans to make sure the public has a fair shot at winning.

Why the "Trainers Secret" well think about who spends the most time with the horse. Most Thoroughbred Horses race once a month or longer, and you or I have no idea what has happened over the time off.

- Has the Trainer changed what the horse is eating?
- Did the horse have a minor illness or injury that the veterinarian has solved?
- The Trainer modified his training regiment with the time off. Did the horse love it, and is it better for it today at the race?
- Has the Trainer decide to run the horse at a different distance today.
- The Trainer decided to run a horse in the front because of training compared to what the horse runs typically.
- A Trainer has a horse starting for the first or second time in his life; who else can know if this horse will win or finish last. Sometimes the Trainer will even orchestrate the finish.
- On the Harness side of the game, there are certain conditions for the race that set up for Trainers to lose races on purpose, and how would you know if the Trainer will take advantage or now or not.

OK, SO WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

It matters because the average horse bettor has no chance to profit wagering on Horses, and the Racetrack owners don't care. The Trainer uses the info like a CEO on Wallstreet. For instance, the CEO knows that his company will be sold. He tells a select few of his friends and partners ahead of the public. They make a fortune while the public finds out too late to take advantage. They call this inside information, and people on Wall Street go to jail for insider trading. Ask Martha Stewart, who went to jail and almost Phil Mickelson.

Trainers share the information about their horse with a select group of other horse people, owners, and professional players. These people then use that information to flood the wagering pool with enough money to impact the odds.

What they are doing is not cheating according to the rules, but it sure feels like it.

We can lobby the Horse Racing Management to change things, but we know how long change can take. So while that is happening, we will work with you to make money under the current system.

In the meantime, "Trainers Secret" is how we make you one of the insiders and take advantage of these situations.

DON'T BET MAIDENS OR NON-WINNERS OF 2 RACES.

Wow, so tell me all these secrets are coming and then first, you tell me not to wager.

When you are trying to make money, horse racing is no different than a business where profit comes from building revenue or cutting losses. Maiden races should not even be betting races.

Not only does the Trainer have all the information; they also have the horses' strategy plans. Many horses go to the race with no intention to win, and we, as horseplayers, have no idea if that is the case.

WHAT are you saying?

A trainer can be sending out a horse with no intention of winning.

WHAT no intention of winning?

That's right, a trainer may be preparing for a stake race and want the horse to practice a particular style of racing without caring if that is best to win the Maiden Race.

The Trainer might think the horse is not ready to graduate from non-winners and decide not to have him win yet.

You might see horses that finish in the money but not win for a few races, building money and then suddenly win at higher odds.

There are many scenarios where a Trainer may not want to graduate his horse, and you have no idea when this will happen. So our suggestion is to avoid Maidens.
