# Introduction

In our day, as intercessors we are living in a time of great significance in the kingdom of God. God is sending forth words from His Throne in heaven regarding our commitment to intercede at all costs. The call to be an intercessor is available to every believer, but sadly some will not step in to the deeper realms of intercessory prayer. According to the Prophet Isaiah, God actively searches for intercessors in the earth to partner with Him concerning His kingdom purpose.

Isaiah 59:16 And he [God] saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor: therefore his arm brought salvation unto him; and his righteousness, it sustained him.

God is still wondering and looking for intercessors today. The above verse speaks of a historical timeframe when God did not find an intercessor so He voluntarily decides to send His only son to fulfill this intercessory demand. Therefore, His arm brought salvation and His righteousness sustained him. It is interesting to study words in the original language. For instance, the word “wondered” in the Hebrew vernacular is shamem, and it means to stun, devastate, or stupefy. In other words, when God did not see intercessors in the earth, He was shocked or devastated because intercession is a major part of His heart. He was totally stunned when He witnessed this heartbreaking condition in the earth.

If God is peering from His Throne looking for intercessors and He is, then intercession is something that is of great importance to Him. The Scripture says that God “saw” that man was not interceding like He had created him to function. As Jesus came to earth to initially fulfill this Throne mandate, He is modeling for us the dynamic principle of being an intercessor.

Today, this same calling is still being issued forth from the Throne of God. God has the capability to know if intercession is being offered from the earth by intercessors. On the other hand, He also is very aware of those that are not functioning as intercessors, too. This is one of the main reasons why intercession is so close to His heart, and it is man’s responsibility to operate the way that God created our hearts to move in His Spirit.
