


Check breathing regularly, and be prepared to carry out CPR.

First aid equipment

- thermometer (preferably digital)
- skin rash cream, such as hydrocortisone or calendula
- Cream or spray to relieve insect bites and stings
- 兽 antiseptic cream
- painkillers such as paracetamol (or infant paracetamol for children)
- aspirin (not to be given to children under 16), or ibuprofen
- 兽 cough medicine
- 兽 antihistamine cream or tablets
- eistilled water for cleaning wounds
- 兽 eye wash

Contact the emergency services at the earliest is vital



The number for contacting the Emergency Services is: 9999/112

112 is in fact a genuine emergency number, which provides the same purpose as **999**.

The only **difference** is that **112** works throughout the EU. Calls to both **999 and 112** can work when you have no signal

Minimising the risk of infection





It is important you do not transmit infections or indeed contract infections yourself. To help minimising the risk of infection and cross-contamination there actions we can be take such as:

- 😁 good personal hygiene
- 😁 Ensuring that barrier devices are used
- 😌 Covering any open cuts or sores
- 😁 Minimising contact with blood or bodily fluids
- 😌 Changing gloves between casualties
- 😌 Washing hands thoroughly after removing gloves.

Remember Doctor ABCD)



Try and get some kind of response from the casualty so the casualty can tell you what is wrong with them. If possible, approach the casualty from their feet as this prevents hyperextension of the neck
